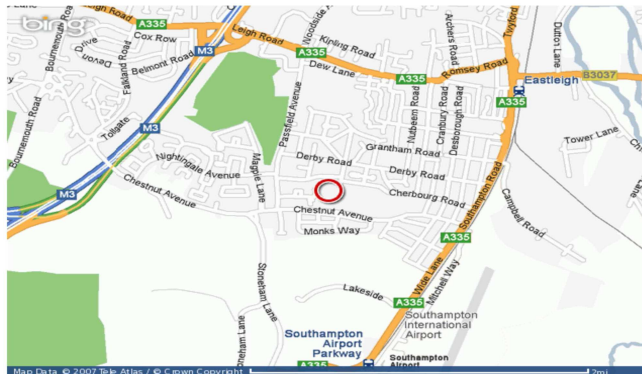

SPEAKERS

Dr Dave Chandler

Dave is a microbiologist and entomologist, and conducts research into invertebrate microbial interactions. His main areas of interest are biological pest control, Integrated Pest Management, and bee health.

Dave has worked at Warwick University Horticultural Research Institute since 1990. Previous to this, he studied for a bachelor degree in biology at the University of Nottingham, followed by a PhD in mycology at Kings College London. He is a Fellow of the Royal Entomological Society and sits on the editorial advisory boards for Biocontrol Science and Technology, and Biological Control. He is also a member of the biocontrol group of the Association of Applied Biologists and a member of Council for the Society for Invertebrate Pathology.

Clive de Bruyn

Clive became a beekeeper in the late 1960s.

He has wide ranging interests and qualifications, including the National Diploma in Beekeeping. He has 'hands on' experience as a beekeeper in many parts of the world, as well as being a bee farmer and a government adviser at the National Bee Unit, UK.

He has spent many years studying varroa and its effects on beekeeping and is the author of many papers and books on beekeeping subjects.

Workshop Leaders

Robert Carpenter-Turner, SBI within the Southern Region. Workshop will cover Foul Brood, Nosema, Acarine, and other common brood ailments.

Melvin Apslett, Portsmouth. Recognised as one of the best mead makers in Hampshire. Melvin will share some of his best-practice approaches to making different kinds of mead.

Bob Robinson, Petersfield and BBKA Exec Member. Bob will show how the beekeeper can save money by turning making beekeeping kit on the cheap.

John Cossburn, Hon Pres HBA. John has many years in beekeeping as practitioner and educator. John will guide attendees through the process of making up nucleus colonies and when the technique can be most effectively used.

John Haverson, Andover. John has been working with top-bar hives for several years and uses a more natural approach to beekeeping. In his words: 'I would like to make the case for more natural beekeeping with less intervention, less stress on the bees resulting in increased vitality.'

June Hughes, Basingstoke. Encaustic wax painting is at least 2000 years old and the Ancient Greeks, Romans and Egyptians all practised it. The word encaustic means 'to burn in'. June gives demonstrations at many clubs, organisations and associations including the BBKA Spring Convention at Stoneleigh.
